Health & Safety Plan – Tiered Mitigation Measures

Western Wayne School District is committed to the health and safety of our students and staff. Additionally, we hope to remain open with in-person learning and continuity of instruction. However, if in-school case counts rise to elevated levels, we may institute the temporary mitigation measures listed below.

In-School Case Counts:

In the event that positive COVID-19 Case Counts rise, and in an effort to keep our schools open for full in-person instruction, the following tiered mitigation measures may **temporarily** be implemented in the school setting.

- Close contacts are defined as persons who have been within 6 ft. for 15-minutes or more of a positive case.

The following are the guidelines for isolation and quarantine:

- Persons who test positive for COVID-19 must isolate for 5 days. If after 5 days, the patient is asymptomatic or has resolving symptoms (**i.e., 24 hours have passed without fever, without fever reducing medication and other symptoms have improved**), their isolation period is over; however, they should still wear a mask around others until day 10.
- Persons who are a close contact of someone with COVID-19 and have received a booster vaccine or are within 6 months of receiving their primary vaccine series should wear a mask around others for 10 days, but do not need to quarantine.
- Persons who a close contact of someone with COVID-19 but are **asymptomatic** may remain in school and should wear a mask around others for 10 days.
- A person who demonstrates symptoms of COVID-19 should stay home and follow CDC/DOH guidelines or consult a physician.
- All exposed persons regardless of vaccination status should test on Day 5 if possible.

***Responding to a COVID-19 Outbreak in Schools**

If a school is experiencing an outbreak or a rise in cases, the school can contact DOH or their local CMHD if additional guidance on outbreak response is needed. To preserve safe in-person learning to the greatest extent possible, DOH staff will work with schools to determine if a closure is necessary and if so, the appropriate closure length, with a maximum 14-day recommendation for full incubation period.

A maximum 14-day suspension of in-person learning may be recommended by DOH if the following criteria are met:

- 5% of students/staff confirmed cases in a 14-day window:
 - Small school (<500 staff & students)
 - Medium school (500-900 staff & students)
 - Large school (900+ staff & students)
