PBIS at Western Wayne

Positive Behavior Support is an initiative of the Western Wayne School District. It is a school-wide strategy for helping all students achieve important social and learning goals. We know that when good behavior and good teaching come together, our students will excel in their learning. EverGreen Elementary is proud to be a part of this exciting initiative.

As part of the PBIS program, we have established several clear rules for the behavior we expect in all areas of our school. We will explicitly teach those expectations to the students and reward them frequently with positive notes and prizes for their great behavior. The expectations for all student behavior will be clear throughout our building and playground areas, cafeteria, gymnasium and classrooms. You will be able to ask your student, “What are the rules in your school?” “How do you follow those rules?” “What happens when a teacher sees you following the rules?”

Our school rules will provide for a safer school environment and give more time for instruction. We will apply consistent consequences and positive reinforcements for all kids. By detailing every expected behavior and teaching kids in a positive way, we will provide a common language for everyone in our building, including students, teachers, front office staff and our paraprofessionals.

Students will have an opportunity to earn “Cat Cash” for use at the CAT CASH SHOWCASE. There they will be able to buy coupons for special privileges within the school or items that catch their eye. Students earn money when they display desired school behaviors. There will be opportunities to earn additional money when students demonstrate exceptional acts of kindness, generosity and leadership. At the end of each month students who maintained appropriate behavior will be invited to attend a building-wide “BLOW-OUT.” We have some impressive events planned for the students.

While our primary goal is to be positive, consequences are part of PBIS as well. When students violate a rule or expectation, a report is generated.

The consequences will vary depending on the severity of the infraction. Students with six or more minor offenses or three or more major offenses in a month will not be permitted to attend a BLOW OUT. The student will be required to attend a social skills lesson. For more about permissible and non-permissible behaviors, check out our table at open house.

We believe that by helping students practice good behavior, we will build a school community where all students have an environment where they can succeed and grow.
