Professional School Counselors are:

School Counselor Qualifications:

School counselors are certified professionals with a master's degree or higher. Their degree is in elementary school counseling, secondary school counseling, or dual certified for elementary and secondary school counseling. In addition to extensive coursework, school counselors are required by the American School Counseling Association to complete a practicum and internship, supervised by a certified school counselor.

What Do School Counselors Do?:

"School Counselors are qualified to address all students' academic, career and personal/social development needs by implementing, evaluating and enhancing a comprehensive school counseling program" (The Role of the Professional School Counselor). The domains are addressed through school wide programs, classroom lessons and individual counseling. They are also trained in crisis response.

Career
