### Brief Job Description

**Film and video editors** edit images, sounds, effects, or graphics for a variety of media, including movies, TV, commercials, or music videos. They can work with producers and directors, or individually, to create post-production media. **Film and video editors** play a crucial role in delivering a final product for audiences to enjoy.

Most employers require film and video editors to have either an **associate's degree** or a **bachelor's degree** in film studies, broadcasting, communications, media production, or a similar field of study. This degree can provide training and experience in the art of editing, which are sought out by media companies and agencies.

By receiving a satisfactory score, you can earn from **3 to 12 college credits** toward your college degree for each CLEP you take, depending on the exam subject. **SAVE TIME.** Get college credit for what you already know. Be rewarded for what you've learned through independent study, advanced high school courses, noncredit adult courses, or professional development. CLEP offers 33 examinations in five subject areas. The tests cover material usually taught in a two-year degree program or in the first two years of a four-year program. Exams contain mainly multiple-choice questions. College Composition and a few other exams contain other types of questions and essays. # College Applications

**What is Early Action?** Early action is the early admission program in which applying early will get you an early answer. This program usually asks students to apply by November 1 and the college responds with a decision by mid-December. However, you are not required to make your decision until the regular May reply date, giving you time to compare financial aid packages between colleges. Early action is non-binding, which means you do not have to attend the college if you are accepted. The advantage of the early action program is that you find out whether you are accepted sooner rather than later, giving you time to enjoy the last few months of your senior year without having to worry about being accepted into college.

**What is Early Decision?** Early decision is similar to early action in that you can apply early (usually by November 1) and get an early answer from your college about acceptance (usually around mid-December). However, with early decision, there is a catch. Early decision plans are binding. This means that if you apply to a college via the early decision process, you must attend that college if accepted and offered an adequate financial aid package. Thus, you can only apply to **one** early decision school. You can, however, apply to other colleges under regular admission. If you are accepted by your early decision college, then you must withdraw all other applications. Keep in mind that early decision may not be your best option if you want to compare financial aid packages between colleges. Early decision colleges usually offer students a better chance of admission if they apply early. When you research schools with the early decision option, check out the acceptance rates for students who apply early decision versus regular admission. The early decision acceptance rates are usually higher.

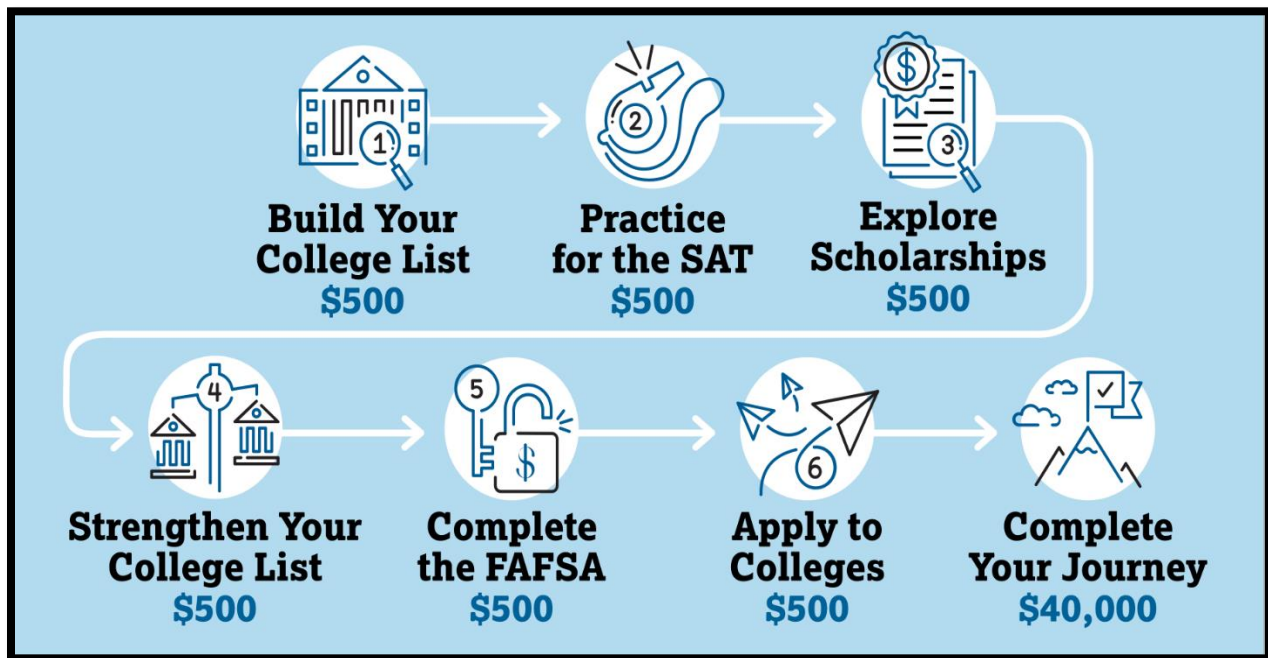

# Western Wayne's Procedures for Submitting College Applications



1. Students applying to a college directly **online** should notify their school counselor.
2. Some college/universities will waive the applications fee if you visit their campus. Other colleges/universities have free online college applications. Students having financial difficulties covering the application fee should see their guidance counselor.
3. **TRANSCRIPT REQUEST- CURRENT STUDENTS:** Students must complete an official Western Wayne **TRANSCRIPT REQUEST** form giving permission to send the student's transcript and test scores. Applications are not considered complete without your transcript. **TRANSCRIPT REQUEST** forms are available on the Western Wayne website (under guidance) or on the opening page under Guidance Resources.

## TRANSCRIPT REQUEST FORMS

- 2) Click on DEPARTMENTS
- 3) Click on Guidance
- 4) Click on TRANSCRIPT REQUEST FORM
- 5) Complete the form

The first request you make is **FREE**. All subsequent requests are **\$5.00**. Bring the check, money order, or cash into Mrs. Lombardi in the guidance office. Your transcript will be sent certified. Please allow one week to process transcript requests! **PLAN AHEAD.**

4. **TRANSCRIPT REQUEST- FORMER STUDENTS Please follow the instructions above.** In addition, if YOU ARE A PREVIOUS STUDENT, a letter requesting the transcript must be submitted with your signature. The letter can be attached electronically with this request or sent to the Western Wayne Guidance Department, 1970A Easton Turnpike, Lake Ariel, PA 18436. The request will not be processed until the letter is received.
5. Your transcript includes your SAT and ACT scores. Check to make sure guidance has your most up to date scores. A few colleges require that you have your SAT/ACT sent directly from the College Board/ACT program (Penn State is one). It is your responsibility to have the scores sent. Questions...see your guidance counselor.
6. Fee waivers are available for most colleges if you received a fee waiver for the SAT or ACT. See your guidance counselor for an application fee waiver. If you are paying an application fee by check or money order, please bring it to guidance and we will attach it to your transcript. Most colleges allow you to pay by credit card when you complete your application online. Checks and money orders must be made out to the college you are applying to. **DO NOT** pay for college application fees with cash!
7. Students requesting Counselor Letters of Recommendation must request the letter at least **TWO WEEKS** in advance.
8. In most instances **Early Decision** applications should be submitted around November 1st. This can vary so watch your dates! Regular Decision applications should be submitted as soon as possible. If you are uncertain about application deadlines see your guidance counselor.
9. **Mid-year grades** will be sent to colleges that require them. It is the student's responsibility to notify the guidance office about sending out midyear grades.
10. Final transcripts will be sent to the college that the student will attend. **FINAL TRANSCRIPT REQUESTS** will be given to seniors at the end of the school year. *Remember, college admissions representatives review all senior year grades very carefully.*

## Virtual S.C.O.P.E. Summer College Opportunity Program in Education

This summer, the Office of Education and Social Equity in the College of Education will once again sponsor the Summer College Opportunity Program in Education (S.C.O.P.E.). The ongoing pandemic situation still prevents the option of hosting a residential program. However, we designed and will offer the option of a Virtual S.C.O.P.E. 2021 Program.

True to the mission of S.C.O.P.E., the virtual program will be designed to provide high school sophomores of diverse backgrounds, **interested in education careers (teaching, counseling, rehabilitation, educational policy or administration)** the opportunity to experience preparing for college, engage in research while simultaneously receiving academic support through the process.

**Virtual S.C.O.P.E.** will be a (3) week academic program during which students will participate in a Research and Writing class, a College and Career Prep class and will be complemented with designated times for academic support. These offerings are not-for-credit courses. The program will run online from **Tuesday July 6<sup>th</sup>, 2021 through Thursday July 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2021**, with classes held on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday each week (9:00am-2:00pm). The program comes at no fee to the participant. It is our hope to prepare students for a successful college experience. Overall, S.C.O.P.E. is a wonderful opportunity through which students get a feel for education careers, college life in general and Penn State in particular.

To be eligible, a student must meet the following criteria:

- *be of a traditionally underrepresented background in the education profession*
- *be currently enrolled in sophomore year (10th grade) of high school*
  - *be enrolled in a college prep curriculum and planning to attend a four-year college or university*
- *have a cumulative grade point average (CGPA) of 3.0 or better*
- ***be interested in a career in the Education field (teaching, counseling, rehabilitation, special education, vocational education, education policy, etc.)***

We also concentrate our efforts in the recruitment of potential **first-generation College students** and **students with limited financial resources**.

The Virtual S.C.O.P.E. application requires the nomination of the school guidance counselor, Future Educators Association Advisor, or other school/program official. S.C.O.P.E. is actively recruiting students interested in careers in the field of education. We recognize that students in their sophomore year of high school are often still exploring career interests; however, because of limited space, our focus is on those students showing interest in education professions. We are asking that nominators fully consider their candidate and evaluate that individual's interest in working in the educational field. Due to the high number of applications we receive, we will be screening candidates very carefully. The nomination and letters of recommendation will be an important factor in our selection process; however, a nomination is not tantamount to an applicant's acceptance.

The application due date (postmark date) is **March 8<sup>th</sup>, 2021**. ## HONORS PROGRAM SCHOLARSHIP

The Lackawanna College Honors Program rewards top academically ranked high school seniors with an incredible opportunity. Most notably, the Honors Program awards the **10 top-ranked students** in each school with **full-tuition scholarships** for up to four years. Students **ranked from 11-20** will be offered **half-tuition scholarships** for up to four years.

The program is offered to every graduating class from partnering school districts across northeastern and central Pennsylvania. This program is the first of its kind in NEPA and is a transformational opportunity for students and the communities served by Lackawanna College.

The Honors Program is much more than a scholarship offer; it also requires that students take part in challenging and comprehensive educational experiences that will prepare them to graduate as leaders ready to change the face of their communities. Experiences will include leadership opportunities, meaningful and immersive service to their community, and demanding coursework that enhance the student experience.

### Program Details

- **Deadline to apply is May 1, 2021.**
- The amount of the award is based upon the student's final class rank.
  - Students who finish in the top ten of their graduation class will be guaranteed a full-tuition scholarship after any applicable financial aid.
  - Students who finish with a class rank of 11-20 will be guaranteed a half-tuition scholarship after any applicable financial aid.
  - The amount of the award is each student's full tuition balance or up to 50% of their tuition balance after financial aid (grants only) have been applied to their account.
  - Students must demonstrate college readiness as determined by a standardized test score (SAT, ACT, or Accuplacer).
- Students must complete a FAFSA prior to enrollment and each year after.
- The scholarship is good for up to four years of consecutive enrollment towards the degree of the student's choice.
- Students must enroll full-time (minimum of 12 credits per semester) in a Lackawanna College program in the Fall 2021 semester following their high school graduation to be eligible.
- Students must maintain a 3.25 GPA, be enrolled in a minimum of 12 credits per semester at all times, and participate in required Honors Program activities to remain eligible for their scholarship.
- Students who choose to utilize the Honors Program Scholarship will not be eligible to apply or accept any other scholarship offered by Lackawanna College. Scholarships awarded to the student externally will be applied to their account as normal.
- This award covers tuition costs only. Fees, books, room and board, and other costs are the responsibility of the student. The College will not make direct cash payments to the scholarship recipients nor create a credit balance on the student's account.
- Students enrolling in the Associate of Science in Nursing program are not eligible.
