- Tell your school counselor if you apply to college online... your transcript needs to be sent out. 

CAREER SPOTLIGHT Nurse Practitioner

Brief Job Description

Nurse practitioners are health care providers that can serve as primary care or specialty care providers and have similar responsibilities to doctors. They can prescribe medication, examine patients, order diagnostic tests, diagnose illnesses, and provide treatment. Their experience in nursing gives them a unique approach to patient care.

Education

Nurse practitioners must first become a registered nurse through an Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) or a Bachelor's Degree in Nursing (BSN). Afterwards, they must enroll and complete a graduate program to become a **nurse practitioner**, either with a Masters in Nursing (MSN) or Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP). Altogether, the college process typically takes between 6-8 years.

CLEP (College Level Examination Program) is the most widely accepted faster credit-by-examination program in the United States today, helping students of all ages earn college degrees faster by getting credit for what they already know. By receiving a satisfactory score, you can earn from **3** to **12 college credits** toward your college degree for each CLEP you take, depending on the exam subject. SAVE TIME. Get college credit for what you already know. Be rewarded for what you've learned through independent study, advanced high school courses, noncredit adult courses, or professional development. CLEP offers 33 examinations in five subject areas. The tests cover material usually taught in a two-year degree program or in the first two years of a four-year program. Exams contain mainly multiple-choice questions. College Composition and a few other exams contain other types of questions and essays. 

College Applications

What is Early Action? Early action is the early admission program in which applying early will get you an early answer. This program usually asks students to apply by November 1 and the college responds with a decision by mid-December. However, you are not required to make your decision until the regular May reply date, giving you time to compare financial aid packages between colleges. Early action is non-binding, which means you do not have to attend the college if you are accepted. The advantage of the early action program is that you find out whether you are accepted sooner rather than later, giving you time to enjoy the last few months of your senior year without having to worry about being accepted into college.

What is Early Decision? Early decision is similar to early action in that you can apply early (usually by November 1) and get an early answer from your college about acceptance (usually around mid-December). However, with early decision, there is a catch. Early decision plans are binding. This means that if you apply to a college via the early decision process, you must attend that college if accepted and offered an adequate financial aid package. Thus, you can only apply to **one** early decision school. You can, however, apply to other colleges under regular admission. If you are accepted by your early decision may not be your best option if you want to compare financial aid packages between colleges. Early decision colleges usually offer students a better chance of admission if they apply early. When you research schools with the early decision versus regular admission. The early decision acceptance rates are usually higher.

Have you heard of 4 or more?

Have you heard about <u>4 or More</u>[™]? It is a College Board initiative designed to inspire, assist, and reward you as you encourage all students to apply to at least four colleges. Over 5,000 of your counseling colleagues nationwide have already joined the movement and are benefiting from the tools and resources they have received.

Why should students apply to four or more colleges?

Studies show that students who apply to two colleges, rather than just one, are 40 percent more likely to enroll in college, and applying to four colleges increases the likelihood that the college they choose will be a good fit for them — academically, socially, and financially.



HOTLINE TO REPORT UNDERAGE DRINKING

Put a stop to underage drinking, before it starts and before it leads to tragedy. Someone always knows about an underage drinking party. Callers to **888-UNDER-21** can report underage drinking parties that are planned or in progress. You can also report establishments that are selling or serving alcohol to those under 21 and people who are manufacturing and selling false identification.



- 1. Students applying to a college directly **online** should notify their school counselor.
- 2. Some college/universities will waive the applications fee if you visit their campus. Other colleges/universities have free online college applications. Students having financial difficulties covering the application fee should see their guidance counselor.
- 3. TRANSCRIPT REQUEST- CURRENT STUDENTS: Students must complete an official Western Wayne TRANSCRIPT REQUEST form giving permission to send the student's transcript and test scores. Applications are not considered complete without your transcript. TRANSCRIPT REQUEST forms are available on the Western Wayne website (under guidance) or on the opening page under Guidance Resources.

The first request you make is **FREE**. All subsequent requests are **\$5.00**. Bring the check, money order, or cash into Mrs. Lombardi in the guidance office. Your transcript will be sent certified. Please allow one week to process transcript requests! PLAN AHEAD.

- 4. TRANSCRIPT REQUEST- FORMER STUDENTS Please follow the instructions above. In addition, if YOU ARE A PREVIOUS STUDENT, a letter requesting the transcript must be submitted with your signature. The letter can be attached electronically with this request or sent to the Western Wayne Guidance Department, 1970A Easton Turnpike, Lake Ariel, PA 18436. The request will not be processed until the letter is received.
- **5.** Your transcript includes your SAT and ACT scores. Check to make sure guidance has your most up to date scores. A few colleges require that you have your SAT/ACT sent directly from the College Board/ACT program (Penn State is one). It is your responsibility to have the scores sent. Questions...see your guidance counselor.
- **6.** Fee waivers are available for most colleges if you received a fee waiver for the SAT or ACT. See your guidance counselor for an application fee waiver. If you are paying an application fee by check or money order, please bring it to guidance and we will attach it to your transcript. Most colleges allow you to pay by credit card when you complete your application online. Checks and money orders must be made out to the college you are applying to. DO NOT pay for college application fees with cash!
- 7. Students requesting Counselor Letters of Recommendation must request the letter at least TWO WEEKS in advance.
- **8.** In most instances **Early Decision** applications should be submitted around November 1st. This can vary so watch your dates! Regular Decision applications should be submitted as soon as possible. If you are uncertain about application deadlines see your guidance counselor.
- **9. Mid-year grades** will be sent to colleges that require them. It is the student's responsibility to notify the guidance office about sending out midyear grades.
- **10.** Final transcripts will be sent to the college that the student will attend. **FINAL TRANSCRIPT REQUESTS** will be given to seniors at the end of the school year. *Remember, college admissions representatives review all senior year grades very carefully.*

Students and parents are encouraged to contact their School Counselor with any questions or concerns.



HONORS PROGRAM SCHOLARSHIP

The Lackawanna College Honors Program rewards top academically ranked high school seniors with an incredible opportunity. Most notably, the Honors Program awards the 10 top-ranked students in each school with full-tuition scholarships for up to four years. Students ranked from 11-20 will be offered half-tuition scholarships for up to four years.

The program is offered to every graduating class from partnering school districts across northeastern and central Pennsylvania. This program is the first of its kind in NEPA and is a transformational opportunity for students and the communities served by Lackawanna College.

The Honors Program is much more than a scholarship offer; it also requires that students take part in challenging and comprehensive educational experiences that will prepare them to graduate as leaders ready to change the face of their communities. Experiences will include leadership opportunities, meaningful and immersive service to their community, and demanding coursework that enhance the student experience.

Program Details

- Deadline to apply is May 1, 2021.
- The amount of the award is based upon the student's final class rank.
- Students who finish in the top ten of their graduation class will be guaranteed a full-tuition scholarship after any
 applicable financial aid.
- Students who finish with a class rank of 11-20 will be guaranteed a half-tuition scholarship after any applicable financial aid.
- The amount of the award is each student's full tuition balance or up to 50% of their tuition balance after financial aid (grants only) have been applied to their account.
- Students must demonstrate college readiness as determined by a standardized test score (SAT, ACT, or Accuplacer).
- Students must complete a FAFSA prior to enrollment and each year after.
- The scholarship is good for up to four years of consecutive enrollment towards the degree of the student's choice.
- Students must enroll full-time (minimum of 12 credits per semester) in a Lackawanna College program in the Fall 2021 semester following their high school graduation to be eligible.
- Students must maintain a 3.25 GPA, be enrolled in a minimum of 12 credits per semester at all times, and participate
 in required Honors Program activities to remain eligible for their scholarship.
- Students who choose to utilize the Honors Program Scholarship will not be eligible to apply or accept any other scholarship offered by Lackawanna College. Scholarships awarded to the student externally will be applied to their account as normal.
- This award covers tuition costs only. Fees, books, room and board, and other costs are the responsibility of the student. The College will not make direct cash payments to the scholarship recipients nor create a credit balance on the student's account.
- Students enrolling in the Associate of Science in Nursing program are not eligible.
