At Western Wayne High School, we believe in creating as many opportunities as possible for our students to plan for their future. That's why we offer the PSAT/NMSQT (Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test). Results from the PSAT/NMSQT provide insight into your child's academic strengths, along with areas they can work on while still in high school, so whether your child is thinking about attending a two- or four-year college, is going to straight into the workforce or is unsure what they want to do after high school, the PSAT/NMSQT can make their path clearer.

Taking the PSAT/NMSQT can also help your child to:

- Enter the [National Merit Scholarship Program](#) (Program requirements are specified in the *PSAT/NMSQT Student Guide*).
- See where their skill levels are and set a target for where they want them to be.
- Practice and prepare for the SAT.
- Find out what AP courses they are ready to take.
- Plan and pay for college.
- Connect to a future career.

This fall the PSAT/NMSQT will be administered in a digital format. Your child can take the PSAT/NMSQT on **October 20, 2026 (make-up date October 21, 2026)**. To register please bring your check or cash to the School Counseling Office.

The cost is \$18.00 with checks payable to: **Western Wayne Guidance Department.**
120 tests have been ordered. They will be provided to the first 120 registrants.

Fee waivers are available to qualifying 11th graders.
